

BEHAVIOUR POLICY (STUDENTS) ADDENDUM

At the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet, we aim to maintain a secure, caring and stimulating environment in which children are encouraged to have respect for themselves and each other. Whilst expectations in our Behaviour Policy remain pertinent, it is necessary, in light of the Covid-19 pandemic, to make some adjustments for the safety of all pupils and staff.

This document should be read alongside the Student Behaviour Policy.

Arrivals, Departures and Moving Around

Children will be dropped off at the gate during their drop off window. Children will take a compulsory temperature check in order to enter the site. There is no need for any other parent/carer to enter site.

At their designated home time, children will leave the building again through their designated exit. Again, there should be no reasons for parents/carers to enter the site.

Movement around the site will be limited. They will always keep 2m apart when moving around (for instance, to their outside space for break/further learning). Children will follow an adult from their bubble on their designated route.

Children will be expected to tell a member of staff if they are unwell and are exhibiting signs of Coronavirus.

Children must have a responsibility for their own equipment and make sure they are not shared with other pupils.

Handwashing and Hygiene

Children will be expected to follow all hand washing and hygiene routines. Children will wash hands/use antibacterial hand gel before entering, after returning from outside, before and after eating and at regular intervals during the day.

We ask the children to follow the catch it, bin it, kill it mantra. If they need to cough or sneeze, they should use a tissue or the crook of their arm (and therefore 'dab'). Children will be reminded not to touch their face, mouth, nose or eyes while at the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet

Should a child refuse to follow these routines, disciplinary procedures and sanctions will be used (see below).

Social Distancing

Children who are old enough will be expected to socially distance from their peers and adults inside and while outside. They will have their own designated space inside any space used which they will be expected to go straight to and nowhere else in the room. Children will put their hand up if they need adult support rather than come up to them.

Teachers will ensure that pupils, wherever possible, adhere to social distancing measures. Where older pupils do not comply, the usual disciplinary procedures and sanctions will be used (see below).

We understand socially distancing may be difficult for younger children, they will be encouraged wherever possible to keep their distance from peers and adults, however, we understand this may not always be possible.

Toilets

Children will be supervised and encouraged to use toilets one at a time. When a child has finished in the toilet, they **must** wash their hands.

Rewards

We encourage teachers to praise individuals for their good work, attitude and good behaviour and show recognition if this is brought to their attention. Above all praise and encouragement should be used as much as possible and can be used to show children model behaviours etc.

Behaviour at the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet

If a child's behaviour is deemed high risk (for example, refusing to adhere to safety measure such as hand washing, social distancing, remaining in their bubbles or deliberate behaviours that put themselves or others at risk, such as spitting or deliberately coughing at people) the following sanctions and disciplinary procedures could be used:

- Conversation(s) with pupil(s) which could include a verbal warning and other behaviour management strategies in line with our current behaviour policy. Ideas for these conversations can be found in the Supporting Conversations with Children document.
- Once all appropriate behaviour management strategies have been exhausted, contact should be made with the pupil's parent/carer.
- If the health and safety of other pupils and staff members are put at risk by the pupils not adhering to social distancing measures, then the parent/carer will be expected to collect the pupil and their membership to the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet may be revoked.

Children with Special Education Needs

the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet acknowledges that children will have had a range of different experiences during the lockdown period which may have an impact on their behaviour presentation. More detail of this can be found in the Wellbeing of Student and Staff document.

As a result of these varied experiences children may present with behaviour that is not usual:

- Anxiety; lack of confidence
- Challenging behaviour, fight or flight response
- Anger; shouting or crying
- Hyperactivity and difficulties maintaining attention

For some children, including those with attachment concerns or SEN, and especially those with autism, the change in routines and lack of familiarity will require additional adjustment. Additional tools for aiding their adjustment can be found in Children with Special Education Needs and COVID-19 document.

the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet recognises that behaviour could be a sign that for some individuals there is an unfulfilled need and that the behaviour is communicating that there is a problem the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet will use reasonable endeavours to make the necessary adjustments to reduce the stimulus that may be triggering the challenging response.

Children with known SEN may have to attend the Hitchin School of Russian Ballet on a trial basis so that staff can evaluate their behaviour in line with our safety measures.

STUDENT BEHAVIOUR POLICY

Please ensure that the following points are adhered to by all students.

- No eating or drinking during class, except for water.
- Ensure mobile phones are switched off.
- Outdoor clothing should not be worn during lessons. The correct uniform should be worn at all times
- All litter to be placed in the bins provided.
- No large hooped or long earrings, watches, or necklaces to be worn for safety reasons.
- Girls hair must be in a bun for ballet, and a neat ponytail for Contemporary. Boys with long hair must be tied back.
- Inappropriate language is not permitted and students will be challenged at all times.
- Bullying is not tolerated at any time and any students found breaking this rule will be asked to leave the school.
